Pastor's Pen, June 2024

It's June! And that means summertime!! I'm pretty sure I say this for every June Pastor's Pen, but I love summer. Maybe it's because I loathe winter so much (unless I get to go out and play in the snow, which isn't often because shoveling snow is not the same as playing in the snow!) But I love summer mostly because it brings about the opportunities for some of my favorite activities: swimming, biking, hiking, more swimming, camping, Whiffle Ball, picnics, more swimming, catching fireflies (and then letting them go!), slushies, more swimming, earlier mornings and later evenings, baseball games, and of course more swimming. And yes, this is all about *playing*.

Remember when you were a kid how summertime was full of play? Many of you have told me the pattern of your childhood play—you'd leave in the morning, maybe come back home for lunch, then be gone again until the streetlights started to come on. And oh, how the days were filled with play.

Author Brené Brown outlines three key "properties of play." First, play is time spent without purpose. Second, play is something we engage in that we don't want to end. And three, in play we lose a sense of ourselves, and we don't feel inhibited. When I consider the things I listed above, all of them fall within these three properties.

Researcher Stewart Brown (no relation to Brené Brown) studied violent offenders and found they all had exceedingly restrictive or zero play during their formative years. Brown makes the conclusion that, "*Play is essential to creativity, empathy, trust, boundaries, and how we grow an active and vital imagination.*"

We live in a culture that values almost solely *hard work and production*. When we do value play it's within the context of competition and striving for victory, which takes...wait for it... *hard work and production*! Do you see the problem here? We have created a culture that no longer values play, and because we have, we *play* very little. Maybe we give ourselves the chance to do it for a week with our family during the summer, but then it's back to hard work and production. Maybe we tell ourselves we are too old to play, and such things are for children. But Brené Brown and Stewart Brown would wholeheartedly disagree.

And so would I! And I disagree because, as Brown says...

"Play is essential to creativity, empathy, trust, boundaries,

and how we grow an active and vital imagination."

Last week Violet and A.J. had their last day of school. Julie took the obligatory last day of school pictures. An hour later we both were at Woodland's Field Day as volunteers to help run a fun water game. A couple hours later we went to Lakeview for their Field Day, again volunteering to help, this time a fun frisbee toss game. (Which by the way, kids today really need to work on their frisbee throwing skills. Whoops! See, even I am guilty of turning play into work! Ugh.) Nonetheless, the excitement and vibe and energy were amazing and fun and joy-filled, and I didn't want the day to end, which makes for a very good day.

So what is something you love to do or something you used to love to do, that is or was so much fun you didn't want it to end, that you lost all track of time, and you didn't feel self-conscious doing? What is "*play*" for you? This is a great question to ask at the beginning of the summer, but on all days too because we need to invite play into our homes, into our families, into our hearts, and most especially into our souls. It's my hope and prayer we will all have many more days this summer that we won't want to end because they are filled with play, filled with excitement and energy, filled with joy and fun.

And we need to invite play into the church as well! And this summer we will—the church picnic was a blast. And coming up this summer we will have that chance with the 4th of July Pancake Breakfast, Vacation Bible School, camps at Camp Christian, the RubberDucks's game, and more. There will be chances for us to play with our family and friends and with our church family. And I hope we take full advantage of each opportunity. And if you can't find anyone to play with, give me a call. Maybe we can go swimming! Or get slushies, or just take a walk, or whatever you want to play! Happy playing everyone!

FRAUD ALERT! Artificial Intelligence And How to Protect Against It!

AI (Artificial Intelligence) enabled attacks are on the rise. Phishing emails have increased by 1,265% since the launch of ChatGPT. AI cloning models for voice and video are expected to emerge throughout the year. We can expect to see a rise in AI-related cyberattacks and fraud scams in 2024. Huntington Bank has sent communication warning us as a business to be vigilant in our attempts to protect ourselves from these attacks. This information is pertinent to individuals as well. Let's start with some definitions:

- Voice cloning or phishing: digital simulations of trusted voices are used to request financial transfers, sensitive information.
- **Deepfakes**: Threat actors use these to create convincing video and audio recordings to impersonate public figures, executives or other trusted individuals.
- **AI-generated images or videos**: often used to create fake identities on social media, fabricate compromising situations for blackmail, or generate convincing evidence to support fraudulent claims.

What can we do as individuals in defense against Cyber Criminals and Fraudsters?

- Consider enhancing verification processes on your phone or computer through multiple factor authentication, biometric verifications, and similar methods.
- Learn about the threat of AI-enabled scams, including how to spot potential attempts, such as inconsistencies in voice or video communications.

Business Email Compromise

This was the top form of cyberattack identified in 2023. These threats are effective because they prey on our instinct to be helpful, and it can be very difficult to identify. Unfortunately, AI is only making it easier for cybercriminals to impersonate legitimate and trusted sources to fool victims. Some common scenarios include:

- 1. <u>Executive transaction request:</u> A fraudster masquerades as an executive asking for a timesensitive transaction, such as an immediate funds transfer or gift card purchase.
- 2. <u>Executive data request</u>: Similar to the executive transaction request, scammers pose as an executive to request HR, payroll, or employee data, including earning statements and tax records.
- 3. Specific payment methods: Attempts often include requests for funds to be transferred via wire transfers, gift cards, or other online payment platforms.

Educating yourself on the tactics threat actors use in their attempts, as well as what to do if an email or text is suspected to be from an illegitimate source, can protect you and your church or other organization you may belong to. Be aware of these **RED FLAGS**

• Portraying a sense of urgency, a crisis, or insisting on confidentiality.

- Sending messages at inopportune times when you might respond in a hurry without thinking clearly.
- Refusing to communicate in person or verbally.
- Asking for unusual payment amounts or payment without proper justification.

Practices to help protect against: CHECK FRAUD

- Use electronic methods to make payments whenever possible.
- Deliver checks to a post office instead of dropping them in the mail.
- Consider switching recurring payments from check to ACH debit.
- Review and reconcile your monthly statements immediately.
- Notify your bank immediately if you discover a check has been forged or stolen.

Cybercriminals are increasingly using AI tools to understand and generate human-like text. These tactics make it easier for victims to be manipulated into performing actions or divulging confidential information. First Christian Church of Stow has been a target of these attempts. Text messages have been sent pretending to be Jonathan asking for a gift card to be purchased. Others have pretended to be Chuck Kobb, asking for confidential pavroll information. Stay alert and be aware and if anything does not feel right, stop and ask. We need to be smarter than the criminals. Keep calling the church, Jonathan, Christian, or another church employee or officer. Don't stop until you get help making an informed decision before you respond to a suspected fraudulent call, text, email, etc.
