#### August 2024 Pastor's Pen

The turn of the calendar from July to August is always a tough one for me as it reminds me that my favorite time of the year will soon transition to a new season. Sure, there are still nearly two "official" months of summer, and sure, the next season always holds its own beauty, wonder, and frivolity—blessings in their own right—but for me, summer is just the best time of the year. (Not to be confused with "the most wonderful time of the year", which is amazing too.) But "back to school" has always been a downer for me, even today when my kids go back to school because believe it or not, I actually like having my kids around all day every day. And yet, this August, I can't help but wonder if my trepidation with the upcoming Fall season has something to do with my worry, and yes fear, that the state of our country, and events happening around the world, are all setting us up for a potentially horrid and dreadful November. These feelings, worries, and wonderings all stem from so much inflammatory rhetoric, blistering judgement and condemnation across social media, which all leads to and fuels ongoing acts of escalating violence.

It's hard to watch or even keep up with the news because it seems like it's always the same news—clear and distinct lines have been drawn where one side embraces their compatriots as wholly complete, sane, righteous, and good, while condemning anyone on the other side of that line as wholly incomplete, insane, unrighteous, and not just bad, but vile and evil. Is this who we are now? Is this the new normal? Where is this going to take us? How will this end? So, yeah, I am worried and a bit fearful.

I've been watching a lot of the Olympics. (I know, that was a hard turn straight out of right field but hang with me for a second.) I've always loved the Olympics—especially the summer Olympics because it has tons of sports that have always enthralled me but rarely got to watch. Sports like water polo, table tennis, field hockey, rugby, fencing, even badminton. (Did you know a badminton birdie, aka *shuttlecock*, is the fastest recorded object in sports at 307 miles per hour!?) And of course, I won't miss any of the U.S. soccer games if I can help it. (Although I was glad I missed the U.S. Men's soccer verses

Morocco. Ugh. That was not fun.) Regardless of the sport though, the Olympics are meant to be a time for the world to come together and do what? Play games. Yes, I will certainly stipulate there is a massive and lucrative financial windfall surrounding the Olympics, not to mention controversy, but yet the *spirit* of the Olympics remains, I think and hope. And it is that *spirit* I seek to embrace and cheer for and, now more than ever, need—the idea, and the reality, of the world coming together to *play games*.

Play. Games. For two weeks that is what we are doing. "We" meaning "the world." We have come together to play games, to watch games, to cheer on games, to be enthralled by games, to cry tears of joy, and yes tears of heartache, all brought on by fellow human beings from all over the world playing games. For two weeks these games are who we are. For two weeks these games are what is normal. For two weeks these games take us to a place of diverse unity. For two weeks it all ends with everyone standing as flags are raised, and anthems are played, regardless of whose flag or anthem it is.

Are these not the ideals upon which our nation was built? Are these not the virtues we hold dear? Life, liberty, the pursuit of happiness—we are doing a grave disservice to each of these when we forget how to play games with one another.

The Gospel of Matthew tells that Jesus said, "Put your sword back into its place; for all who take the sword will perish by the sword." These words of our savior tell us those who live by the sword die by the sword, that those who speak violence and act in violent ways are met with violence. This is why if the state of our country and our world today is going to change and be better by this Fall, we need better, calmer, more righteous minds, more compassionate and empathetic hearts, and more "Olympic spirit" and Holy Spirit in one another and shared with one another.

So may we aim to be *Olympians* in our own way—sharing and spreading a presence and a spirit that embraces and celebrates the beautiful and diverse world our Creator has made, all while we seek to play games with anyone and everyone.

### <u>Summit County Safe Surrender Initiative</u> Houses of the Lord, August 7-10, 9 p.m. – 5 p.m.

#### Friends,

Below is a letter from Akron Municipal Court regarding their upcoming Safe Surrender event. This event is a safe way for people who believe they have a warrant to appear before a judge with a public defender and have their case heard in hours rather than days or months, and without the risk that comes with arrest or search warrants being carried out. If there's a loved one in your life who is looking to put their troubles with the law behind themselves as quickly and safely as possible, please share the information below with them. Most people with non-violent offenses aren't taken into custody. Be aware, they cannot serve cases outside of Summit County.

For the first time in ten years, local agencies are partnering for "Summit County Fugitive Safe Surrender" which will take place August 7-10, 2024 from 9:00 a.m. until 5:00 p.m. each day. By going to the House of the Lord at 1650 Diagonal Road in Akron, fugitives can safely turn themselves in.

Those looking for services and assistance should arrive prior to 4:00 p.m. each day to allow for sufficient processing time. While it's not an amnesty program, Summit County Fugitive Safe Surrender grants people with outstanding felony and misdemeanor warrants (including traffic violations) a chance to resolve those issues in a community-based setting.

This program offers an opportunity for individuals who have a warrant or license forfeiture to surrender in a safe environment. Pursuing a safe surrender helps reduce risk of the fugitive, the law-enforcement officers who pursue them and the neighborhoods that harbor them. This also clears judicial dockets which helps serve the community.

In addition to the Akron Municipal Court, representatives from Barberton Municipal Court, the Summit County Common Pleas Court General Division and the Summit County Domestic Relations Court will be on-site along with each corresponding Clerk of Courts and Prosecutor's Office staff.

Additional partners working in support of this event include Summit County Executive Ilene Shapiro, the Summit County Sheriff's Office, the Summit Legal Defender's Office, the Ohio Attorney General's Office, the Akron Bar Association, Oriana House and the Akron Police Department.

The last event of this nature took place in June 2014 at the House of the Lord.



#### <u>Update from the Finance/Stewardship Team</u> <u>Financial Giving – Through June 2024</u>

Hello all! Though we are still finalizing all expenses for June,). The Leap of Faith amount for 2024 is \$18,787 (Budgeted Expenses minus Budgeted Income).

As you may recall, the Governing Board and the congregation approved the 2024 budget proposed by the Finance/Stewardship with the budgeted Expenses being higher than the budgeted Income. We refer to this difference as our Leap of Faith. We can achieve that Leap of Faith combining 2 goals; increasing our Income (primarily made up of Individual Giving) and decreasing our Expenses by controlling our spending. Here are 2 views that show our progress towards meeting our Leap of Faith. These compare our total actual income to our total budgeted expenses, showing how close we are now at the end of September, comparing that to end of August.



The Total Income budget amount is \$22,878 per month. This includes congregational giving and other income sources like building rental.

The Total Expense budget amount is \$24,444 per month.

The Leap of Faith amount is the difference between our budgeted Expenses and our budgeted Income. For the full year that amount is \$18,787 and monthly the amount is \$1,566.

If you prefer to think of this as a percentage, our actual income needs to be 7% higher than our budgeted income to meet our Leap of Faith, and thru the end of June our income is 3% lower than our budgeted income. If you personally are feeling financially stable and would like to make an additional gift to the church above your normal giving, those are always appreciated. Any increases will help position us to be able to meet our Leap of Faith, and to sustain the outreach assistance we can provide to our community, both locally and globally. Please let any member of the Finance/Stewardship team know if you would like to see our full reports, we are happy to share them. We also will be sending out individual giving statements so you can see (and confirm) the financial gifts you have made so far this year.

Frequently Asked Questions

Q - Are any of the options above easier/harder for the Financial Secretary to handle?

A - Nope! Bill pay thru your bank account generates a paper check to the church. Vanco or PayPal generates an email notification. Either way, the information still needs to be entered into the church's management software.

Q - What are the fees and how can they be offset?

A – They vary for Vanco/PayPal but generally the fee is 2%-3% of the transaction amount. This can be offset by increasing the amount given. For example, you wish to donate \$100, then make the transaction \$103. There are no fees to you or the church when you set up your giving through your bank's website.
