December 2024 Pastor's Pen

When we were kids, and the calendar turned to December, my brother Greg, sister Kim, and myself would have secret "Christmas meetings." When we were really little, these meetings were held in the closet of my brother and I's room. Eventually, however, the years of accumulating stuff from Christmas and birthdays, along with our own yearly growth spurts, pushed the meetings out of the closet and into the bedroom, but still behind closed doors and away from mom or dad who we were certain would want to know every detail of these secret "Christmas meetings." Of course, now I realize they probably wished we had had these meetings every night so as to give them a much desired and needed respite from their three active and loud kids in a small house.

Greg was the oldest, so he set the agenda and led the meetings. Kim, the middle child, would always insert her own mode of leadership into the meetings though, which mostly consisted of telling me to settle down, be quite, and quit going on and on about the need for every meeting to have refreshments. The agenda though was always the same, centering around what time we would wake up, how Kim would sneak over into our room, how Greg would take on a reconnaissance mission to the living room and assess not only the loot left behind by good ole St. Nick, but also if the milk, cookies and carrots left out for him and the reindeer had been completely or just partially consumed. And then I would also strenuously recommend that as he made his way back from his recon mission he should somehow secured refreshments for our "Christmas Morning Christmas meeting" where we would have to agonizingly wait until the assigned time our parents declared we were not to leave our beds until.

It's funny looking back on these memories now. Those years of congregating early on Christmas morning with my siblings didn't last very long because soon my older siblings were of an age that sleeping—no matter what the day—was the priority. Afterall, the presents would be there whether they were opened at 7 a.m. or 10 a.m. Besides, the earlier you got up, the sooner "Christmas was over", a refrain that become more ubiquitous each year. But the amusing part of all this is that though the years of Christmas meetings and early rising were few, the term "Christmas meeting", and even the act of discussing our Christmas Day plans, still remains part of our lexicon and yearly planning all these years later. In fact, just last night, via Facetime, we had a

"Christmas meeting" for this year, and there will probably be the need to have another one in the coming weeks as we get closer to the big day.

What kinds of traditions and memories of Christmas' long, long ago do you still have? Do you still do any of them? Christmas memories are among some of our most cherished, aren't they? I'm certain we can all remember particularly special gifts we received, but I'm willing to bet what we remember even more than all the gifts are the traditions and memories—the places we've celebrated Christmas and most especially the people we celebrated with. We remember how our Christmas celebrations made us feel so full of joy and love. We remember how Christmas was truly the most wonderful time of the year because it implored us to be with those we loved the most.

Christmas is such a special time, and each Christmas we remember past Christmas' with our traditions and our memories. And we do this because deep with each of us is a longing to reconnect and even relive the goodness of all those previous joyful times. And what is at the heart of each of our traditions, memories, and celebrations is the greatest story in the world—the story of God's son coming into the world so the world would not be judged, but saved—saved from a story that could only end in separation from God *unless* God sent the world a Savior.

It is my hope and prayer that in the weeks to come you will be able to take time to look back on your Christmas memories, the Christmas stories you can recall as if they happened yesterday, and tap into the joy and love that is at the root of those stories. It is my hope and prayer you will have the opportunity to live out some of the traditions you and loved ones have created and crafted together, and you get to instill them and pass them along to those in the younger generations of your family. And most of all, it is my hope and prayer you will see your stories and your memories and your traditions coming out from the greatest of all stories—that long ago, in the strangest of places, in the oddest of ways, in the fullness of time, God sent God's son, Immanuel, to fully recovery what was lost, forgotten, and had gone astray. Because that is what Christmas truly does, and it's why we celebrate this blessed time. Our stories are all part of thee greatest story. Happy Advent and Merry Christmas to all.

In other news our new freezer unit arrived and is in place in the kitchen. We are sharing this freezer with Bulldog Bags (they picked up half the cost). This freezer makes in possible for us to provide frozen groceries to our guests. We will also use it to store items for the Loaves & Fishes meal.

We're Hiring! Custodian Needed Flexible Hours & Fair Pay

First Christian Church of Stow is seeking a part time custodian. Duties include routine cleaning of bathrooms, classrooms, common areas and sanctuary. This includes duties such as but not limited to sweeping, mopping, buffing, and cleaning floors and entryways; dusting furniture and equipment; washing walls and windows; vacuuming carpets; emptying trash; replacing light bulbs and fluorescent tubes: keeping necessary items stocked. Responsible for maintaining inventory of cleaning supplies.

Individual hired must be a self-starter. Must be able to lift a minimum of 40 pounds and climb a stepladder. Work closely with other church staff and report to the church Trustees. We offer flexible hours along with a low-pressure work environment. This job is 15 hours per week with flexible schedule Monday through Saturday with a pay scale of \$12-

15 dollars an hour based on skill level and experience. Additional hours could be requested for weddings, special event, building rentals and funeral luncheons. Must be able to pass a preemployment background check and drug screening.

72nd Anniversary for Alcoholics Anonymous At First Christian Church of Stow

A Shared Sorrow is A Sorrow Halved

While we may consider the primary work of service and outreach that we do at this church our main focus, over the past several years, we've had groups come and go that all share in a secondary area of outreach that we serve: Support Groups for those in need of help. Those of you may remember that we had Al-Anon, the support group for loved ones of alcoholics, but our first and longest running outside

group activity is the Stow chapter of AA. They have met in Fellowship Hall for years, hearing each other's stories, sharing in fellowship, and mentoring those struggling with addiction, isolation, and every other challenge that is correlated with chronic alcohol abuse. They are both faithful stewards of our home, and faithful family to each other.

On Thursday, the 14th of November, 2024, they celebrated their 72nd anniversary as a chapter. Though numbers fluctuate, they have a solid 30 members who come weekly to meet, talk, share a warm cup of coffee, and share their burdens and celebrations. We are grateful, as a church, to host such an important service to the community. That those who are struggling, hitting rock bottom, and sometimes, required to help by law, find that help here. They find fellowship, community, healing and wholeness, here.

Continue to hold this support group in your prayers, and consider visiting or offering their services, if you know someone who is struggling to find a way to manage their relationship with alcohol. If anything is a testament to their value as an organization, and this chapter specifically, it has outlived its founders and continues to serve people in need.

The Outreach team is preparing for our biggest outreach project of the year: Ingathering.

Your help wanted and needed!

Even though it is not yet Halloween, the outreach team is hard at work preparing for Christmas Ingathering. Ingathering is a huge and vital ministry for our church and community. Last year we served 44 families with children (food, coats and gifts) and 10 additional families with food assistance. It is a huge cooperative effort between businesses and organizations in the community, the Stow Munroe Falls City Schools and the generous and giving folks in this congregation. If you want to shop, wrap, make a donation, bake cookies, make phone calls, assist with excel program forms or want more information about the program, please see Ann Halpin or call 330-524-2228. You can also help us prepare for this ministry by:

1) buying items that may be on sale now for the food boxes (please check expiration dates). Possible items can include cereal, pasta, canned tomato products, tuna, juice, canned meat, mac and cheese, jelly, peanut butter, and soup. I try to buy a little bit of something every couple of weeks when things are on sale, especially now when grocery prices are high.

- 2) Discuss with family members if you might, as a group, sponsor a family for Ingathering.
- 3) Discuss with your employer if they might like to make a donation or sponsor a family for Ingathering.
- 4) Consider donating new or used/ in good condition, household items. Families are often grateful for that lamp you no longer need, children's toys that your children have outgrown, holiday decorations, photo frames, pet supplies, folding chairs, unused candles, and women's purses to name a few. Tools, command strips, cleaners and cleaning supplies, laundry soap and plastic storage bins are also much appreciated.

Leaps of Faith

A word about our 2025 First Christian Church Budget

When we give to the church we are giving to God. And these gifts go towards ministries, programs, Christian education, worship, staff, and everything you expect such gifts to go towards. And yet, when we give to God, our gifts also go to coffee fellowship supplies, utility bills, cleaning supplies, maintenance of our building and grounds, and yes even basic sanitary needs in our restrooms. No these aren't exciting or "mountain top inspiring" as many aspects of church usually are, but best assure they are all necessities of being church.

Nevertheless, no matter the magnitude, nor the insignificance to what our gifts are used for, our gifts are still gifts to God because we know and believe God is at work in and through our church, and God's work is always for good. Which means, a cup of coffee after worship can spark a moment in a fellowship conversation where someone shares with another difficult news of a loved one or from

their recent doctor's appointment, and a door of love and support is opened. It means the lights are on and the building is warm for the person who has made the incredibly hard decision to walk into our church and attend their first Alcoholic Anonymous meeting and begin their journey to recovery and new life. It means the phone will ring and a staff member will answer the call from a single parent of three children whose heat is about to be turned off and they will be heard, and hope will be offered. Each of these, and countless situations like them, are all leaps of faith that can be taken because we generously give our gifts to God.

Everyday leaps of faith are taken by people who have no other choice but to take a leap of faith. And leaps of faith are taken even by our church because we know what God is calling us to do and what God is calling us to be. Which is why our 2025 church budget includes again this year a Leap of Faith of its own. This Leap of faith represents ministries, programs, and needed funding not yet covered by pledged and anticipated giving. And yet we remain hopeful through God's good work these funds will come to fruition through the faithfulness and generosity of folks who will see and recognize the life impacting work God is going through First Christian Church of Stow.

For 2025 our church's Leap of Faith is \$22,823. Yes, this is a significant sum of money, but it is not one that is impossible for our church—especially when we continue to trust in the One who guides and blesses us.

Please take note, if you have not yet turned in a 2025 Estimate of Giving Card there is still time to do so. Additionally, if you are feeling moved to adjust your 2025 Estimate of Giving Card since submitting it back in October, you still have time to do so as well. To turn in a card or make an adjustment, please do so by mailing in your card to the church office or by calling or emailing Lisa Roseman who will be more than happy to hear from you.

God is always at work, and God's work is always for good. May our trust in this truth guide and inspire us into and throughout the New Year. And may all we do as First Christian Church of Stow help guide and inspire others to know that with God, they can always take the leap of faith they need to take and God will be there to help them land safely.
