Pastor's Pen, January 2025

An email came to me on Thursday, January 2nd that had as its title, "Lent Begins in just 63 days! Ordered your devotionals yet?!" January 2nd. The wisemen haven't even made their January 6th Epiphany pilgrimage appearance yet, and here I am getting an email telling me Lent begins in just 63 days and so I need to be sure to get my Lenten devotional ordered lest I am ill-equipped and unprepared for the forty days, plus Sundays, "journey through the wilderness" and to the cross at Calvary. Sheesh! We haven't even packed up the baby Jesus and already we're being told we need to prepare to walk with him through the desert of Lent. The wisemen are still westward leading, still proceeding, following the "star of wonder, star of light, star of royal beauty bright", but yet we are being told to get ready to muddle our way through the dim valley between Bethany and Jerusalem all the way to Golgotha. I mean... I get "getting ready", but couldn't they have sent that email on January 7th? Would a few more days make any difference in sales of their Lenten devotionals?

I do this a lot, I know. I rant about the timing of the seasons and timing of the holidays-Christmas starts too early, and it definitely ends too soon. (I once again saw Valentine's Day products out and available for purchase before Christmas!) I know I rant about the pace of the world, and the expected pace pressed upon us as individuals by the world. I rant about how we never slow down, how we are always pressed to go faster, do more, and get more accomplished. I rant about how we don't even know how to slow down, let alone take or observe sabbath. And I make all these rants of disgruntlement and discouragement all while I remain guilty of succumbing to them all myself. (However, I will NEVER buy any Valentine's Day products BEFORE Christmas! Never I tell you!)

Maybe I'm ranting this rant because Christmas and the holidays are over, and now we begin the long slog through the rest of winter, hoping against hope the groundhog will see their shadow and Spring will be here sooner than later. And actually, my hope for an early spring is one reason why I don't get upset at all retailers who are quick to move ahead from winter to spring, or even summer, and start to put out their "warm weather" products. I have been known, on particularly dreary, cold, gray days, to stop into Lowe's and check out their new line of grills, lawn mowers, weed whackers, and patio furniture just to get a glimpse of summertime. There is a great opportunity for us to be proactively engaged in an important and crucial community conversation on the day we observe the birthday of Rev. Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. (See inside this issue of the Pathways for more information about that event.) There are fun and exciting church fellowship opportunities. There are people in our church family who need our prayers and our presence. There are still hungry students in our community who are dependent upon our offerings to Bulldog Bags, and still others who will need us to be ready and prepared to serve them at Loaves and Fishes Plus Pantry.

Dare I say the work of Christmas isn't over? Dare I say, the light of the world that came at Christmas is still shining, and we are called to make sure it shines in any and all dim places where we can? Yes, I believe I read somewhere "do not worry about tomorrow for tomorrow will worry about itself." (Matthew 6:34) So yeah, I'm going to rant—again—that though Christmas may be over (on January 6th) the work of Christmas still remains for us to do. After all, it's just 356 days (or less) until Christmas!

Merry Christmas and Happy New Year everyone! May God's blessings be seen and felt and received in great abundance by you all in 2025.

2023/2024 Comparison

Sunday December 15 was the last Loaves & Fishes + Pantry for 2024. We served 49 families consisting of 128 individuals. As usual everybody who wanted a hot meal got a hot meal of creamed turkey (or chicken) and every family received groceries.

We handed out groceries with the usual mix of dinners, canned fruit & vegetables, bread, Entenmann's treats, cereal, milk and other items We were able to add blueberries to the grocery bags this month because of our new freezer.

As you can see our 2024 numbers were a little lower than 2023. We must all keep in mind that we are serving a need in our community. The number of neighbors who need help varies all the time. Let's take it as good news that our numbers are a little lower. Meanwhile our costs were up. In 2023 we spent \$2,819 at the Food Bank on groceries. In 2024 we spent \$3,367 for an increase of \$558. There is one major reason for this increase. Every year the Food Bank receives various government grants that they use to purchase certain food items. They pass the savings on to agencies like us, which means that we can get free food. There was less of this government grant money available in 2024.

Of course, we focus on using these grants whenever we can. In 2023 we were able to use these grants to obtain \$1,172 worth of food items. In 2024 we were only able to obtain \$564 worth of items with grant money. That works out to a decrease of \$608 of food items obtained via grant money, which is more than our cost increase.

In 2023 our average cost per family was \$4.80; in 2024 the average cost per family was \$6.35. Even with the increase \$6.35 is a phenomenal price for a week's worth of groceries.

We look forward to your continued support during 2025.
