Pastor's Pen, March 2025

Over the past week or so I have been keeping a watchful eye on the developing health concerns of Pope Francis, having seen and read about how he showed improvements a couple of days ago, but as of the writing of this piece, had just taken a worrisome turn over the last couple of hours. All of this compelled me to seek out any message of his already shared about the upcoming season of Lent that is set to begin on March 5th with Ash Wednesday. And to my delight I found just such a message entitled, "Let Us Journey Together in Hope." Due to space constraints, I will share just the opening to this piece, but I encourage everyone to find it and read it in its entirety as it is both a touching and inspiring piece from a deeply devoted servant of God. Pope Francis begins, saying,

Dear brothers and sisters,

We begin our annual pilgrimage of Lent in faith and hope with the penitential rite of the imposition of ashes. The Church, our mother and teacher, invites us to open our hearts to God's grace, so that we can celebrate with great joy the paschal victory of Christ the Lord over sin and death, which led Saint Paul to exclaim: "Death has been swallowed up in victory. Where, O death, is your victory? Where, O death, is your sting?"

Again, while the entire piece is faithful and inspiring, I was struck how Pope Francis in just the first two sentences guides us to see the truth that even in the ashes of our sins, we are invited to open our hearts to God's grace so we can celebrate with great joy the paschal victory of Jesus over sin and death. His statement runs completely counter to what so many of us think about when it comes to sin—especially the sins we have committed. Usually we are filled with remorse, guilt, and shame for our sins, unable to forgive ourselves let alone willing to accept that the One who is all powerful and all-knowing would so freely and willingly forgive us of our sins. And yet, Pope Francis offers the call to open our hearts in the midst of the ashes of sin so that we *can* celebrate. Has any of us ever faced our sins and thought that we ought to celebrate in the midst of our sinning? Of course not! We know sin separates us from God, furthering the gap between us and the divine. And yet Pope Francis calls us to *celebrate* the great joy the paschal victory of Christ over sin and death. He

is reminding us, we don't lose because we have sinned, rather we win because Christ Jesus us loves us so much that he willingly took on death...and won for us.

And how can we, in our ultra-competitive, ultra trash-talking culture not revel in Pope Fracis' use of the Apostle Paul's own trash talking, where he exclaims, "Where, O death, is your victory? Where, O death, is your sting?" It's a line that sounds like it could have come right out of any sports underdog movie where the unlikely team of misfits overcomes impossible odds and defeats the unbeatable. Think, "The Bad News Bears", "The Mighty Ducks", "Hoosiers" "Miracle" "Rudy" "The Karte Kid" "Remember The Titians", and "Rocky II, III, and IV", just to name a few. (And arguably, we could include Rocky I, even though he lost to Apollo—but Rocky won in many other ways!)

No, the season of Lent doesn't scream "time to celebrate." Certainly not like the Advent and Christmas seasons do. No radio station is playing "Lent songs" months before Holy Week because there aren't any! And yet, there is reason still to celebrate, isn't there?

Yes, Lent implores us and guides us to take a good long look in the mirror, and see who we are, and who we don't want to be. Lent takes us into a time of wilderness wandering where we are left to follow a path of fasting, a path of temptation in a weakened state, a path of uncertainty about whether or not we will be able to endure to the end. And yet Lent implores us to celebrate because we can remain mindful and hopeful that even if we are guilty or ashamed of ourselves, God is not. Even if we are too weak to follow the path, God will give us strength. Even if we convince ourselves the end will never come, God will inevitably, and gladly, pick us up and carry us to the end. And when we reach that end, we too, like the Bad News Bears, the Mighty Ducks, like Hickory High (Hoosiers), the 1980 U.S. Hockey Team, Rudy and his teammates, like Daniel-san and Mr. Miyagi, like Coach Boone and his team of integrated football players, like Rocky Balboa, and like the Apostle Paul himself, we all get to cheer and chant, "Where, O death, is your victory? Where, O death, is your sting?"

I am eager and looking forward to the Lenten journey we are all about to take together.
